Challenge Tips For Each Box:

1. **Read a book with more than 500 pages:** Select any 500+ page book or ask a librarian for suggestions.
2. **Attend a Newington library event:** All library events are listed in the April/May issue of *Footnotes* and online on the library's website.
3. **Read a book recommended by a friend:** Or librarian! No Children's books, please.
4. **Use Transparent Languages to learn a foreign word:** To access Transparent Languages, go to the library's website, click on Online Resources, click on Lan-

Tips For Each Box (continued):

- Learning, click on Transparent Language Online OR ask a librarian.
5. **Read a classic novel:** Choose any classic Adult novel you wish or ask a librarian for suggestions.
 6. **Checkout and use one of the library's tablets or eReaders:** Some checkout for use at home, some for 3 hours for in library use. It's a great way to see if you like these devices. Ask a librarian for more information.
 7. **Read the book/watch the movie:** Many books have been made into films. Choose any title, then read the book AND watch the movie. Ask a librarian for suggested titles.
 8. **Use a library museum pass:** The library has free and discounted passes to 29 area museums and attractions. For more information and to reserve your pass, go to the library's website, then click on Museum Passes, or ask a librarian.
 9. **Read a nonfiction book and learn something new:** Will it be a cookbook, car repair manual, craft, religion, gardening, health, history, computer, travel book or something else? It's your choice!
 10. **Attend a library event:** See tip #2.
 11. **Read a magazine on Zinio or OverDrive:** Download a magazine to read on your computer, tablet or cellphone. Go to the library's website, then click on Download Media or ask a librarian.
 12. **Learn something new with Lynda.com:** To access Lynda.com, go to the library's

- website, click on Online Resources, click on Education, then Online Classes.
13. **Read any book:** Your choice! No Children's books, please.
 14. **Attend a library event:** see tip # 2.
 15. **Read a book by a female author:** your choice! No Children's books, please.
 16. **Read a novel set in New England:** Can't think of a title? Ask a librarian.
 17. **Read a book published in 2016:** Browse the library's Adult new book section.
 18. **Attend a library event:** See tip # 2.
 19. **Watch a movie on Hoopla:** Stream a movie to your computer, cellphone or tablet. Go to the library's website, then click on Download Media or ask a librarian for help.
 20. **Read a book recommended by a librarian:** Go to the Information Desk or call 860-665-8700.
 21. **Read a book with a number in the title:** Can't think of a title? Ask a librarian.
 22. **Recommend a book to a friend:** Or librarian!
 23. **Read a NY Times bestseller—past or present:** Find the list at www.nytimes.com/best-sellers-books or ask a librarian.
 24. **Read a book with red on the cover:** Select a book with the color red anywhere on the cover. No Children's books, please.
 25. **Read an eBook from OverDrive, Hoopla or Freading:** Download an ebook to read on your computer, tablet or cellphone. Go to the library's website, then click on Download Media or ask a librarian for help. Or, read an eBook on one of the library's Nooks or tablets.
