




Books To Read With Your Baby




Peek-a-Who? By Nina Laden


Look Look! By Peter Linenthal


Where is Baby's Belly Button? by Karen Katz

Have fun introducing body parts to your little one. The adorable babies play peekaboo in this delightful interactive book with easy to lift flaps that will delight your baby into their toddler years.




How Big Is Zagnodd? By Sandra Boynton


I Love You as Big as the World by David Van Buren


I Wish You More by Amy Krouse Rosenthal


Barnyard Dance by Sandra Boynton

Everybody sing along - because it's time to do-si-do in the barnyard with a high-spirited animal crew! One of the many great titles by Sandra Boynton.




The Baby Goes Beep by Rebecca O'Connell

Beep! Boom! La! Flip! Yum Splash! Smooch! A baby makes various sounds as he explores the world around him.




Goodnight Moon by Margaret Wise Brown

Learn to imagine a world without racism with Antiracist Baby! Follow the nine easy steps for building a more equitable world.




Time For Bed by Mem Fox

Darkness is falling everywhere and little ones are getting sleepy, feeling cozy, and being tucked in. A sweet and soothing bedtime read!




Feminist Baby and Feminist Baby! He's a Feminist, Too! by Loryn Brantz

Feminist Baby likes pink and blue, playing with cars and dolls, and the choice to become whatever she dreams. Feminism is for everyone, even boy babies.




Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star: a collection of bedtime rhymes

Hot, hot, hot! Everyone is hot. The baby elephant knows just what to do; lead all the big animals down to the water, where they can drink and squirt and splash!




The Wonderful Things You Will Be by Emily Winfield Martin


Salsa Lullaby by Jen Arena


Welcome to the Party by Gabrielle Union


My Heart Fills with Happiness by Monique Gray Smith


Besos for Baby: A Little Book of Kisses by Jen Arena


Global Babies by The Global Fund for Children
